## Bat Chat Amphitheatre Presentation

Discover the bats of Manitoba with bat scientist Kaleigh Norquay from the University of Winnipeg. After the presentation, we will head out on a short walk around the Visitor Centre with bat detectors to try and get a first hand look at these mysterious mammals. *Wear sturdy walking shoes and bring water.* 

# Never a Bore with Wild Boars Guided Hike

#### Saturday, September 9 1 p.m. – 3:30 p.m.

#### Location: Meet at the Winter Recreation Area to convoy to the Hogsback

Join a Park Interpreter and guest Devon Baete, manager of field operations for Squeal on Pigs Manitoba, to explore the Hogsback site and look for evidence of wild boars. We'll learn about the destruction and danger this invasive species causes and what we can do to help. We will be meeting at the Winter Rec Area to drive through the park's scenic backcountry to the Hogsback. A high-clearance SUV or pickup truck is required for this 35 km round trip.
